Twickenham 3 October 2013: The new look World Rugby Museum officially reopened. It houses the world's finest collection of rugby memorabilia - over 25,000 iconic object dating back to the start of the game.

Located under the East Stand of Twickenham Stadium, the World Rugby Museum was given a wholesale makeover this summer in preparation for the hotly anticipated home World Cup in 2015.

As well as a contemporary re-brand for the world's finest collection of rugby artefacts and even more films and iconic footage of rugby's most memorable moments, a brand new 'Play Rugby' interactive zone has been created. This allows visitors to test their own skills including speed, jumping ability, strength and kicking prowess and poses the question: 'What Kind of Rugby Player Are You?

The museum's award-winning educational facilities are now also integrated into its permanent galleries.

Old favourites return in a refreshed setting including:

- A glittering array of trophies including the Calcutta Cup, the intricately engraved trophy made of 270 silver rupees that England and Scotland have been competing for since 1879.
- The only surviving jersey from rugby's first-ever international in 1871.
- The real story of William Webb Ellis and how he didn't invent the game.
- Film and video footage, including the Rugby World Cup film, which allows visitors to re-live some of the most memorable rugby moments as they journey through the ages.

On the 1st November you can also take part in one of these demonstrations during 'Have a Go' Falconry Day. Sharon Hollens, the farm's resident falconer will be happy to answer any questions visitors have about any of the birds. You can also visit the conservation and rearing room to learn more about the life cycle of different birds. When all the animals and birds have been visited there are always the two outdoor adventure playgrounds to tackle, jumping pillows to bounce on and a round of mini golf to master. You can also

take a tractor and trailer ride (weather permitting) to enjoy and explore the beautiful surrounding countryside.

# Dining out with Kids

Restaurants & Children Can Co-Exist thanks to new KID-FRIENDLY Sticker

We all know the nightmares of eating out with small children. Whether a parent yourself or a diner in the same venue as a family with a screaming baby/unruly children, what should be a great night out has a tendency to turn into a nightmare for all involved.

MotherDriven has made it easy for both parents and restaurants by creating and distributing a KID-FRIENDLY Sticker Further on the site, Editor and Mum Olivia Richardson has identified five top tips for dining out with kids.

Etiquette guidelines include:

Etiquette guidelines include:

1. Call beforehand to make sure the restaurant's equipped for kids. Does it have a high chair available? Are kids' meal options on the menu? If not, that's a dead giveaway it's not kid-friendly and it's best to look elsewhere.

2. BYO entertainment – an iPad, crayons, paper... whatever will maintain the kids' attention for about two hours.

3. Watch wanderers. Kids can get bored easily and a restaurant can be a busy place where the kitchen's often open and breakables and sharps are at their reach. Remain seated at all times please!

4. Grab-proof the area. Make sure the wine glasses, the water glasses - whatever's breakable isn't within reach of a grabber's curious little fingers. 5. Take screamers out, ASAP. It's time for a walk outside if vour child opens their lungs, Jimmy Barnes' style, at the dinner table. Kids or not, patrons won't (and shouldn't have to) put up with this. "Parents should know most of these guidelines already, but given the horror stories we've heard it seems they're not putting them into practise," says Mum, diner and online editor of Motherdriven.com Olivia Richardson



# RHS Celebrates Harvest with 'Taste of Autumn' Food Festival and London Shows

Appetising events being held 16 - 20 October

RHS Garden Wisley, Surrey will celebrate harvest this October with Taste of Autumn, a festival aimed at foodies, families and growyour-own enthusiasts. The festival will take place from Wednesday 16 to Sunday 20 October and will feature cookery demonstrations, apple tastings, stalls, family activities at the weekend and a host of famous faces. At the heart of the festival will be more than 40 local producers and experts selling

autumn produce and tasty dishes, including cheese, sausages and pies, fruit and veg, chocolate, breads, tempting snacks and street food. Celebrity chef James Martin headlines the roster of foodie talent and will be signing books at 2pm on the Wednesday. Food writer and local produce champion Rosemary Moon will be holding cookery demonstrations in the marquee alongside preserving workshops from Taste of Wisley. Later in the week

author Sarah al-Hamd will be talking about her latest recipe book Sun, Bread and Sticky Toffee.

RHS experts will be on hand all week, giving talks and master classes on growing your own food in Wisley's famous veg plot and fruit demonstration gardens. There will also be talks on edible mushrooms, cheese making, beekeeping and cheese and wine tasting. Those wanting to make a day of it can start their festival experience with a harvest brunch at the Wisley Restaurant from 10-11:30am over the weekend. The brunch includes classic egg dishes, Greek yoghurt with Wisley berry compote, brioche rolls with Fruit Field iam and freshly pressed Wisley apple juice, all eaten while the chef gives a talk on how to cook and preserve the autumn bounty. The Restaurant will also feature a three-course autumn lunch menu, specially devised to show off Wisley

# Go Batty for Bats' and Halloween Family Discovery Day

Half-term activities at the Isis Education Centre in Hyde Park

Two Halloween-based activity days for families:

Go Batty for Bats (Family Workshop) -Tuesday 29 Oct 10am-12noon, £10-£15 Hyde Park and Kensington Gardens are home to several different bat species - common pipistrelles, soprano pipistrelles, and noctules - and Royal Parks Foundation team at the Isis Education Centre at the LookOut in Hvde Park runs events to inform visitors about them.



# **Bullying- One of the Greatest Crisis** Facing us in Society Today

With children now 'safely' returned back to school, cognitive neuroscientist and chartered psychologist Dr Lynda Shaw is calling for parents, teachers, carers and friends alike to tackle bullying head on as it increasingly becomes one of the greatest crises facing us in society today.

Shaw says: "Bullying is unacceptable. Full stop. There is never a situation that justifies bullying. It is too awful to contemplate that not only do many of our children not feel safe at school, they may also have problems when they are using their computers in their own home, because we are witnessing a rise in teenage cyber bullying. It is common knowledge that if children and teenagers bully they often turn into adult bullies. Bullying needs to be strongly addressed in school by teaching target children what precisely they need to do to help themselves, such as considering body language and how to be assertive, even if they feel insecure and downtrodden." Shaw suggests that getting the bully and target to talk is a good idea, but a third party needs to be involved whether it be a teacher, teaching assistant or school counsellor however she estimates one in four

so called 'light' bullying and only intervene around 5% of the time

"The NSPCC report that 38% of young people have been affected by cyber-bullying and 18% of children and young people who are worried about bullying said they would not talk to their parents about it. 8 out of 10 young people believe that cyber bullying is getting worse, according to research from the Diana Award Anti-Bullying Ambassadors programme. Cyber bullying is spiralling out of control. Shaw argues that whenever anyone is made to feel bad about themselves, this can be a clear warning that they are being bullied. Bullying is increasingly having tragic consequences, with targets often under achieving at school or work, becoming isolated, developing anxiety and depression, and in extreme cases being driven to end their own lives. Shaw believes that with the right help, the targets of bullies can deal with their emotions and bring a successful end to their bullving. Shaw's book, 'Beat the Bullies: Use your brain' is designed to help children who are being bullied while giving them a clearer understanding of the wonders of the brain.

# Low Omega-3 could explain why some children struggle with reading

University study has shown that a representative sample of UK schoolchildren aged seven to nine years had low levels of key Omega-3 fatty acids in their blood. Furthermore, the study found that children's blood levels of the long-chain Omega-3 DHA (the form found in most abundance in the brain) 'significantly predicted' how well they were able to concentrate and learn. Oxford University researchers explained the findings, recently published in the journal PLOS

The study was presented at the conference by co-authors Dr Alex Richardson and Professor Paul Montgomery from Oxford University's Centre for Evidence-Based Intervention in the Department of Social Policy and Intervention.

'Technical advances in recent years have enabled the

measurement of individual Omega-3 and other fatty acids from fingerstick blood samples. 'These new techniques have been revolutionary - because in the past, blood samples from a vein were needed for assessing fatty acids, and that has seriously restricted research into the blood Omega-3 status of healthy UK children until now,' said Dr Richardson.

The authors believe these findings may be relevant to the general UK population, as the spread of scores in this sample was within the normal population range for both reading and behaviour. However, they caution that these findings may not apply to more ethnically diverse populations as some genetic differences can affect how Omega-3 fatty acids are metabolised. Most of the children participating in this study were white British.

# **Switched-on Parents** ahead of Primary Schools in use of iPads for Learning

Tech savvy and engaged parents are using iPad apps to give their children a head start in education, and are keen for primary schools to follow their lead. The leading UK education app developer, Apps in My Pocket, conducted a survey of 456 parents. It revealed how the *iPad* is changing the way children are learning to read and write

Parents using the iPad or iPad as a learning tool for 3-7 year olds were surveyed. Parents that were using education apps at home were overwhelmingly in favour of using iPads in primary schools, with 88 per cent of the respondents supportive of the idea. A recent Ofcom survey has highlighted the increasing use of iPad and other tablets in the home. which more than doubled in the last year\*. However this isn't being reflected in schools. Primary schools in the UK

are starting to use iPads to help children with reading and writing skills. However the survey indicated that only 40 per cent of primary schools were using iPads at all, with most having just a handful. Android based tablets were even more rare, with only three per cent reporting their schools using them. Which leaves 57 per cent of primary schools not even experimenting with tablets in education. Use of iPads drops to 18 per cent in pre school.

The survey showed that while costs are a prohibiting factor, the iPad was far more prevalent in schools than cheaper Android based tablets by a factor of 14:1.

# How to get the most out of Open Days – 6 top tips.

By Louise Simpson, Head, Bromley High School

Open events in Schools can be challenging for all concerned. What if the weather is poor? What if we can't squeeze everyone into the hall? What if the carefully rehearsed Year 7 pupils forget their lines in the presentations? With everyone at the school doing their best to show you the school in its best light, there is much at stake. But it can be a challenge for prospective parents and pupils too, so how can you get the most out of the open days and what should you be looking for when you go?

1.Plan ahead - it is never too early to start looking at possible schools for your offspring, and sometimes two or more visits are needed to get a good sense of the school and the personnel there. Parents often visit my school two or three years in advance, and we welcome then when they come back again, it is nice to have a chance to forge a relationship with the family before joining. 2.Choose your schools - just as it is not a good idea to sit your child for lots of entrance tests, it is not a good idea to visit too many schools. You will lose clarity over the specific offer of each of the schools and start to get muddled in your decision making. You will feel more focussed in your visit if you have some clear criteria over school choice before planning open day visits (ie Single sex or co-ed? Boarding or day?

3.Do your homework research the school in advance, have an idea of what you are looking for when you get there. If your child is a great swimmer, make sure that you have researched the quality of the pool and the inclusion of swimming in the curriculum for example. If your child is a brilliant musician, make sure the schools you are visiting have music scholarship programmes and a wide range of visiting music teachers. Local reputation, friends and family as well as the literature and website can give a clear picture.

4.Be ready to be surprised despite doing your homework, you may still find that there is much about a school that you did not know, that you can find out on the visit. Keep an open mind when you are there and be prepared for surprises; hopefully they will be pleasant


5.Listen to the pupils - the pupils are the product of the school and an excellent school will produce impressive pupils in every respect. Ask the pupils questions; do they know their school well? Are they proud of their school? Do they reflect the values and ethos of the school? Everything you need to know about the quality of teaching and learning, the co-curricular programme and pupils' personal development

should be evident from the pupils and their behaviour. 6.Ask to come again - all schools can put on a good show once in a while, but the real proof of the pudding is in the eating. Ask to come back and meet key personnel and have a tour on a working day. This really will show the school in its true light and, hopefully,

will make the decision making easy. If the school cares about you making the right decision they will happily welcome you back and will do all you can to make you feel as welcome as possible on that visit and on subsequent ones.
