Endometriosis: Fertility implications, symptoms and treatment

Dr Sebastian Renz MRCP, DFFP, Richmond Practice Medical Director provides an insight into the symptoms and treatment of endometriosis and how it affects fertility. Endometriosis is a condition in which the tissue (endometrium) normally lining the womb (or uterus) grows outside, on and around the pelvic and abdominal organs. We most often find that it is associated with heavy and/or abnormal menstrual flow and painful periods. Over 1.5 million women are affected by endometriosis in the UK. As far as we know the problem is hereditary. Endometriosis can cause infertility, depending on how the disease has affected the reproductive organs. In some cases the fallopian tubes can become blocked which causes damage to the ovaries, making conception increasingly difficult and causing infertility.



Consult your doctor, if you: Struggle with painful and heavy periods Have chronic pelvic pain Experience pain during sexual intercourse You cannot get pregnant We find that symptoms can vary in severity depending on where the endometriosis has implanted and how long the woman has had the condition. **Diagnosis and treatment** Endometriosis is diagnosed by excluding other conditions, such as fibroids with similar symptoms. It requires a thorough assessment by a GP or Gynaecologist. At **Richmond Practice** a female consultant Gynaecologist will meet with you to discuss your symptoms. She will then do a pelvic examination, ultrasound scan and/or blood tests. Once all other causes are excluded the final diagnosis is made by referring for a laparoscopy or key-hole surgery. With the help of a camera the doctor will establish whether endometrial tissue outside of the womb developed. If tissue is found, it is treated at the time laparoscopy is undertaken. 



Royal Institution launches new videos to revolutionise science learning in the home

The Royal Institution of Great Britain has announced the launch of a new web series of **Experimental**, which supports and empowers parents and families to do easy and fun science activities at home as often as they would arts and crafts or cooking. Following on from the success of the first 10 films released in summer 2014 which explored physics, this second series encourages families to get stuck into chemistry.

Experimental aims to give viewers the confidence and ideas to explore, question and test some of the fundamentals of science with children aged four to nine. The activities have been specifically designed to appeal to those families who have never considered doing science at home with their children or who do not feel confident in their abilities to do so. All the activities require only common household objects or cheap and easy to buy materials. You can watch the first film of this second **Experimental** series **Colour Quest** and all 10 films from the first series www.rigb.org/experimental. The remaining chemistry films will be released one per week until 17 March 2015 when they release three films in one week in celebration of **British Science Week**.

Science Week. All the films are free to watch. The second series is set to be even more exciting than the first. The presenters come from all over the UK including families in Scotland, Wales, England.

Physics teacher and filmmaker **Alom Shaha**, who helped developed the project, said: "Experimental films encourage viewers to go several steps further than simply carrying out the activity. As well as covering basic scientific facts, **Experimental** focuses on developing scientific skills like observation, prediction and how to conduct a fair test. Worksheets help parents to prompt their children to look more closely at what's happening, to ask questions and to discover the answers for themselves. These films are not just about demonstrating cool scientific phenomena and providing an 'explanation' but about encouraging children to explore science through play." **Dr Gail Cardew**, Director of Science and Education at the Ri, said: "For 200 years our mission has been to encourage people to think more deeply about the wonders and applications of science and the **Royal Institution** is often called 'the home of the science demo'. **Experimental**

embodies this 200 year old mission completely by bringing exciting hands-on science into people's homes, wherever they may live. "With **Experimental**, our ultimate goal is to help parents, grandparents, aunts and uncles, teachers, health workers, foster parents and childcare professionals to spark the natural curiosity of children at an early age through play and to set them on a lifelong course of scientific exploration and investigation." **Dom McDonald**, Outreach Programme Manager at the **Royal Society of Chemistry** which supports this second **Experimental** series, said: "We think it's hugely important to support activities outside school that make chemistry accessible to new audiences. That's part of the fundamental principles of the **Royal Society of Chemistry's** 170 year-old Royal Charter and is just as relevant today. We're very excited to have this opportunity to support the Ri in such a fun and exciting project."


