## Blowing the Whistle on the General Dental Council.

Newer treatments can achieve better and more permanent results without extractions but orthodontists avoid comparative research as they don't want the damage they do to faces to be exposed.

Worst of all the General Dental Council allows orthodontists to withhold information about some newer methods. This leaves many patients accepting extractions and even major surgery unaware that improved techniques can render them unecessary. If you have suffered you are entitled to compensation.

Data shows that, while the majority of those who study physics (52.4%) go on to further study (studying for Master's and PhDs), those who go into employment earn an annual salary almost £3,000 more than graduates of all

The data, gathered from almost 6,000 final year graduates from 55 universities between 2006 and 2010, suggests the average salary for a physics graduate one year after graduation is £22,500, contrasting favorably to the average graduate salary in 2008 of £19.700.

The unemployment rate is significantly lower among physics graduates than all graduates - in 2007 8% of physics graduates were unemployed, while the national average for all graduates stood at 18% - and the increase in graduate unemployment.
